Tang's journey to raise funds for scholarships

Charlie Tang is picking up where Bing Wong left off. Tang, who purchased King's Cuthay Inn in San Bernardino from Wong, wants to create a \$100,000 scholarship fund to be used each year for college-bound graduates of S.B. high schools.

Wong personally donated \$40,000 and raised the other \$60,000 in the aid of charity golf tournaments. The scholarships are distributed each year from the interest earned on the money — about \$5,000 per annum.

Next Wednesday at noon at El Rancho Verde in Walnut, Tang will hold his first scholarship tournament. It's a \$50 entry event for the shotgun start. The entry fee includes dinner at King's.

The tournament is one of many fund-raising activities planned by Tang to raise the money. The S.B. Rotary Club will be the administrator of the fund.

Steve Furnas of North Rotary said that anyone wishing to play must sign up at King's, 940 W. Highland Ave.

If Tang reaches his goal, he will be the third member of North Rotary to have a \$100,000 scholarship fund established. The others are Wong and Joe Hertel.

Strong Ryder Cup team faces Britain

LIGNON, Pa. (AP) — America's big guns, Jack Nicklaus and Tom Weiskopf, will play Scott Bryon, Harold and Bernard Gallacher in a featured pairing Friday in the opening round of the Ryder Cup golf matches.

"They're good friends together a lot," American non-playing captain Arnold Palmer explained of his action in putting his two aces on the same team.

"It's just a matter of trying to get players together whose temperaments match, whose games are compatible. It was what you might call a very pleasant problem."

The other opening pairings, as named by Palmer and Bernard Hunt, the non-playing captain of the British-Irish team, are Gene Littler and Hale Irwin vs. Norman Wood and Maurice Bembridge; Al Geiberger and Johnny Miller vs. Tony Jacklin and Peter Oosterhuis; J.C. Snead and Lee Trevino vs. Tommy Horton and John O'Nahry.

"Littler and Irwin have similar temperaments," Palmer said. "Snead and Trevino have been friends for a long time. Geiberger and Miller, well, I'm not sure why I put them together. Maybe because they're both Irish."

Morning round play will be South forecasters, in which each two-man team plays alternate shots on the same ball. The first four best-ball matches will be played, with scoring based on the better ball of each two-man team. The pairings for the best-ball match will not be made until after morning play is completed.

The same format will be followed Saturday. Sixteen singles matches Sunday will complete the biennial competition that the Americans have dominated since British seer merchant Samuel A. Ryder put up a trophy for the international competition in 1927.

The British have won only three times, only once in the decade since World War II and never have won in matches played in the United States. The Americans, with perhaps their strongest team ever, are heavily favored again.

Palmer, however, declined to make any victory predictions.

"Obviously we have a very strong team," he said. "But I certainly don't want to be put in the position of making any predictions. Those sort of things can come back to haunt you."
